Foundation Enrolments 2025

The Department of Education has released an updated statewide Foundation (Prep) enrolment timeline for the 2025 school year.

The timeline advises families when and how to enrol their child into Foundation (Prep) at a Victorian government primary school, including Sale Primary School.

All government primary schools will follow the timeline in 2024 to support Foundation (Prep) enrolments for the 2025 school year.

You can find information and resources about the timeline, including factsheets and a poster at: [Enrolling in Foundation \(Prep\)](#). You can also download the 'Foundation (Prep) Enrolment Information Pack for Parents and Carers' from [Enrolling in Foundation \(Prep\)](#) (available from 15 April 2024).

You were able to apply to enrol your child in Foundation (Prep) 2025 at Sale Primary School **from 16 April 2024**.

What you need to do:

1. Use [Find my School](#) to locate your designated neighbourhood school (referred to as your local school) and other nearby government schools.



All policies related to the care, safety and welfare of students at Sale Primary School are available from school reception upon request. Visit the school or contact sale.ps@education.vic.gov.au

2. Contact our school on 51 445545 to book a school tour or to learn more about our school and the enrolment application process.
3. Download the Foundation (Prep) enrolment information pack from [Enrolling in Foundation \(Prep\)](#) (available from **15 April 2024**). Collect an enrolment form from our school.
4. Submit our enrolment form for Foundation (Prep) by **Friday 26 July 2024**.
5. You will be notified of the outcome of your application **between Monday 29 July and Friday 9 August 2024**. If you receive an enrolment offer, you should contact our school to accept the offer by **Friday 23 August 2024**.
6. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2024.
7. Prepare your child to start Foundation (Prep) from **Wednesday 29 January 2025**.

Enrolment applications submitted after 26 July 2024 will be processed by our school as they are received, in accordance with the department's Placement Policy.

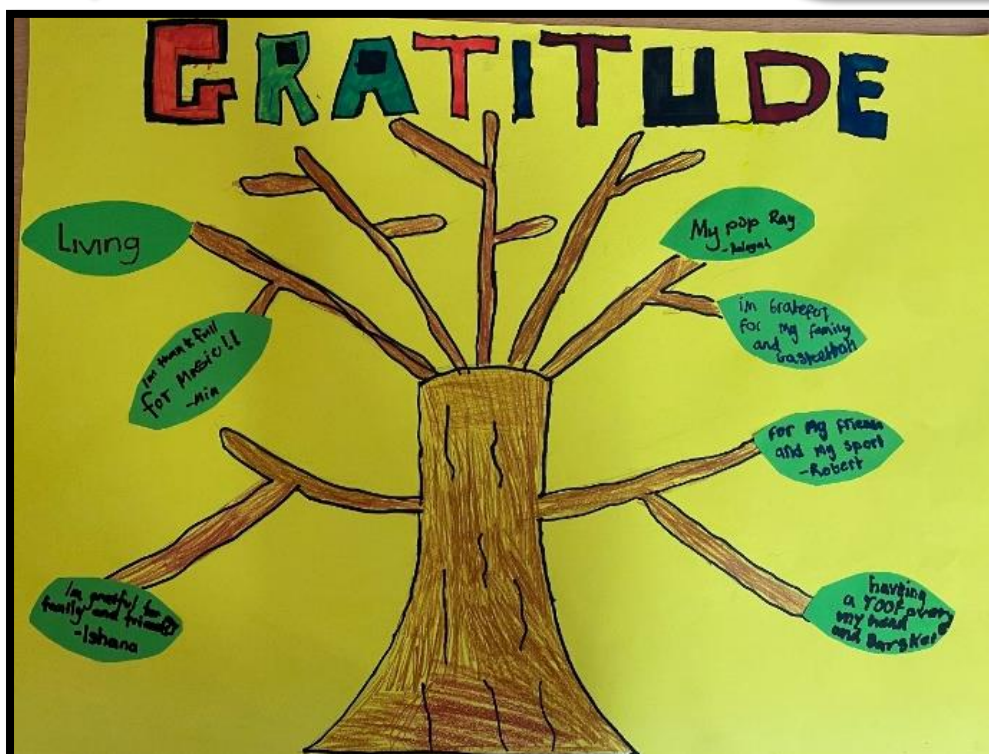

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments;** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances;** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.



Premiers' Reading Challenge!

The Premiers' Reading Challenge is open again for 2024. The Challenge encourages children and students to read a set number of books over the year and record their efforts online. Since the Challenge first began in 2005, more than 3.5 million students have read over 54 million books.



There is an opportunity for any student that is interested to participate in the Premiers Reading Challenge. By completing the challenge the student will receive a certificate bearing the signatures of the current Premier and living former premiers. This is an optional program that can include the regular nightly reading that students are already doing!

If you're interested in participating in the Premiers Readers Challenge, you need to:

1. Register with Mrs Lambourn
(this can be done via a message from mum/dad on Compass or a note from Mum/Dad to Mrs Lambourn)
2. Read a certain number of books during the Challenge, as shown below. Students in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 can read books by themselves or with someone else.
3. Get your log in details from Mrs Lambourn
4. Log the books you have read on line
5. Get Mrs Lambourn to verify that you've read the books you've registered online.
6. Make sure all your information is completed online by the 1st September 2024.

Number of books you need to read

Foundation to Year 2

- Number of books: 30
- Number of books from the Challenge book list: 20 or more

Year 3 to Year 6

- Number of books: 15
- Number of books from the Challenge book list: 10 or more

ART ROOM NEWS

LOU COOPER



Middle and senior students did a phenomenal job with their Belynda Henry and Andy Goldsworthy inspired pieces.

The middle cohort looked at Australian artist Belynda Henry's reflected landscape series. There were a few processes to their artworks. Firstly, they folded their paper in half, then drew a landscape background on the crease line. Students then used blue watercolour paint for the water and sky, and oil pastels for mark making on the rocks and trees.

The following week they used acrylic paints in earthy muted colours to paint the landscape, folding the bottom half of the paper up to create the reflection.

To finish it off, they used white chalk in horizontal sweeps on the water. Seniors watched a video about UK nature-based sculptor and photographer Andy Goldsworthy. We discussed the artist and analysed more of his amazing art pieces. Students then created their own designs using foraged leaves, shells, sticks, berries, nuts and bark in either radial, symmetrical or asymmetrical designs similar to Goldsworthy's designs.

I am so proud of the amazing work all students have created. To coincide with the theme of the next exhibition, all students' artworks will be on display at the Gippsland Art Gallery next month in the children's gallery section

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

When should I register my child for kindergarten?

If your child is turning three or four years old before 30 April, they can be registered for 3 or 4 year old kindergarten.



You can complete an **Expression of Interest** any time before your child is due to start kindergarten, we will notify you when it's time to complete a registration for 3 or 4-year-old kindergarten.

Lodge an EOI online for free.

If your child is old enough for 3 or 4 year old kindergarten, make sure you apply using Council's **Kindergarten Central Registration Service** between 1 May and 30 June to be eligible for first round offers.

Online registration is free.
