
# Respectful Relationships

Middles finished their Ugly Dolls soft sculpture sewing unit last week. We watched the Ugly Dolls movie trailer and discussed the message in the film and all the different dolls looks - their body shapes, features, teeth, number of eyes etc. Students used a template guide I created to draw a sketch of their doll, then drew the body shape on chosen felt colour. They then glued on their legs, arms, ears, teeth, eyes, hair. I demonstrated to the students (about 10 times in total over 3 lessons) how to thread a needle, tie a knot and do a whip stitch. # **Premiers' Reading Challenge!**

The Premiers' Reading Challenge is open again for 2024. The Challenge encourages children and students to read a set number of books over the year and record their efforts online. Since the Challenge first began in 2005, more than 3.5 million students have read over 54 million books.



There is an opportunity for any student that is interested to participate in the Premiers Reading Challenge. By completing the challenge the student will receive a certificate bearing the signatures of the current Premier and living former premiers. This is an optional program that can include the regular nightly reading that students are already doing!

If you're interested in participating in the Premiers Readers Challenge, you need to:

- Register with Mrs Lambourn (this can be done via a message from mum/dad on Compass or a note from Mum/Dad to Mrs Lambourn)
- 2. Read a certain number of books during the Challenge, as shown below. Students in Foundation, Year 1 and Year 2 can read books by themselves or with someone else.
- 3. Get your log in details from Mrs Lambourn
- 4. Log the books you have read on line
- 5. Get Mrs Lambourn to verify that you've read the books you've registered online.
- 6. Make sure all your information is completed online by the 1st September 2024.


