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## **NEW PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT EWEN JONDAHL ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL**

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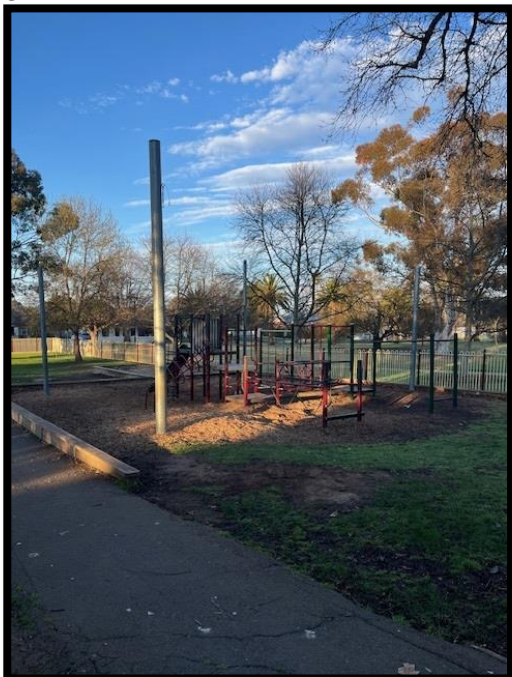


Starting Saturday August 24, we will have workers in to remove the playground and sandpit (as pictured below).

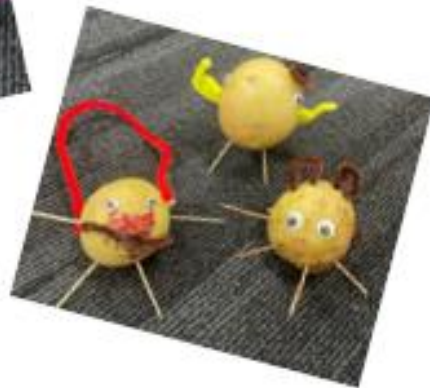

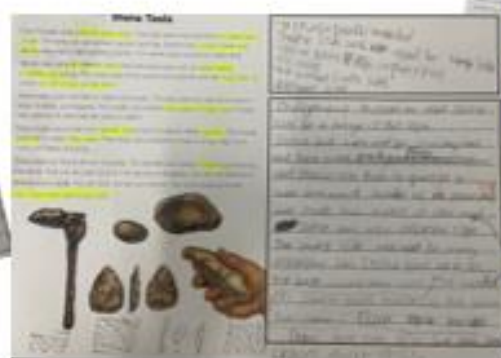
