2026 Foundation Open Day/Information Tour

Following our successful open day recently, the 2026 Foundation enrolments are now open.

The Department of Education has released an updated statewide Foundation (Prep) enrolment timeline for the 2026 school year.

The timeline advises families when and how to enrol their child into Foundation (Prep) at a Victorian government primary school, including Sale Primary School.

All government primary schools will follow the timeline in 2025 to support Foundation (Prep) enrolments for the 2026 school year.

- You will be notified of the outcome of your application between Monday 28 July and Friday 8 August 2025. If you receive an enrolment offer, you should contact our school to accept the offer by Friday 22 August 2025.
- 5. Take part in enrolment information and transition sessions during Term 4, 2025.
- 6. Prepare your child to start Foundation (Prep) from **Wednesday 28 January 2026**.

Enrolment applications submitted after Friday July 25 2025 will be processed by our school as they are received, in accordance with the department's Placement Policy.

WELLBEING EDUCATION WEEK DEREK HAYMAN



The theme of Education Week in 2025 is *Celebration of Cultures*, where schools are encouraged to celebrate the diversity of the school community, and the importance of every child feeling safe and welcome at school.

At Sale Primary we are lucky to have many different cultures that are part of our community. With over 30 nationalities represented at our school, we have a lot to celebrate.

Throughout this week students will be exploring the picture book *Our Skin: A first Conversation About Race.* This thoughtfully written board book serves as a powerful conversation starter for children and adults, offering a safe, informed, and supportive way to begin discussions about race and racism.



SPOTLIGHT ON TEACHING AND LEARNING

💞 As we begin Term 2 it has been fantastic to showcase our school during the Open Day to prospective new families.

We are very proud of all we do at Sale Primary School, and it is a wonderful opportunity to share the hard work our teachers and students put in every day.

The Foundation

students have been learning the name and sounds for x, y and z as well as reviewing the ones they have already learnt during their phonics lessons. When reading the students are learning to retell using a 5 finger strategy to help them recall the important parts of a story including the main events, setting and characters. In writing the students are being taught to represent as many sounds as they can. They are also




being taught to use lower case letters and to use spaces between groups of letters (words).



Our Junior students are such amazingly resilient learners as can be seen when they move around the classrooms for the first 30 minutes of each day for SSP (phonics). The students are placed in groupings which target their specific needs in phonics with highly structured and engaging lessons. In reading this term the students have been reading Fairy Tales and learning about the imaginative, narrative structure. The Fairy Tales structure has also been integrated into writing where the students have been creating imaginative narratives which include villains and heroes. Such imaginations at work!

The marvellous Middle students have had some

intensive teaching of spelling concepts during word work including long vowel sounds, prefixes and word building. These lessons are specifically targeted and fast paced lessons. In reading the students have been focusing on analysing information texts and identifying specific language features. The texts used have been based on notable historical people. When writing the students have been focused on using punctuation to ensure their message is easily understood by a reader.



In word work, our Senior students have been looking at the etymology of words which in turn helps with the ability to spell and use them. In reading and writing they are being inspired by fabulous mentor texts. The students have been responding to specific questioning about authors' purpose and literary devices used to evoke interest.




SALE & DISTRICT CROSS COUNTRY CARNIVAL BEN CHIVERS

School Saving Bonus reminder and allocation to school activities

The Victorian Government is delivering the School Saving Bonus (SSB) – a one-off support of \$400 for eligible government school students from Prep to Year 12 in 2025.

The SSB can be used for uniforms and textbooks until Monday 30 June 2025.

Any funds remaining after 30 June 2025, including online voucher amounts that have not been redeemed, will become a credit to use on school activities.

However, the credit will not be available on your family account at our school until late July. To use any remaining SSB funds to cover the cost of school activities in July, please refer to the SSB online system and allocate the funds to school activities before 30 June 2025. To learn more about the SSB online system, download the step-by-step System guide for parents and carers (DOCX, 945KB) or watch this School Saving Bonus video. System guide translations are also available in 14 languages.

The Department of Education's SSB contact centre will remain available until 30 June 2025. The contact centre can be reached by:

completing the School Saving Bonus enquiry form calling 1800 338 663, between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm on weekdays.

After this date, please contact our administration team for any SSB related questions.

Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund Reminder

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. Means-tested concession cards must be valid on the first day of Term 1, 2025 (Tuesday 28 January 2025) or Term 2, 2025 (Tuesday 22 April 2025).

A student aged 16 years and over who is considered a mature minor and holds a valid concession card is also eligible to apply.

Eligible families will receive a payment of \$154 per year for primary school students and \$256 per year for secondary school students [remove primary/ secondary as necessary]. The funds will be paid directly to the school to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on [insert school phone number] and ask for an application form. Please return completed application forms to the school office as soon as possible.



Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open, and Sale Primary School is excited to be taking part!

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 and aims to help young readers develop a lifelong love of reading.

It is not a competition; it is a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 5 September 2025.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.


Since it began in 2005, more than 4.5 million young readers have taken part and together read more than 63 million books!



FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE INFORMATION FOR PARENTS

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund helps ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's background and their outcomes.

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

if you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$150 for primary school students
- \$250 for secondary school students

HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the website below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- new student enrolments; your child has started or changed schools this year.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
