# AUSTRALIAN MATHEMATICS COMPETITION SUZY JOHNSTON



Taking place from Tuesday August 5 to Thursday August 7, the Australian Mathematics Competition (AMC) is Australia's longest running and most well-known maths competition for school aged students.

Topics for the AMC vary and will

include a wide range of mathematical concepts, as well as problem-solving questions. The competition includes a total of 30 questions with 25 multiple choice and 5 integers, designed each year by leading educators and academics to challenge and extend your students' problem-solving skills.

This competition is available to students from Years 3 to 6, primary divisions are allocated 60 minutes to complete the AMC.

Registrations are now open, with printed entries closing on Friday July 4. The cost to participate in the AMC is \$9.00 AUD per student.

Last week foundation students learned about the artist Joan Miro and his surrealistic and dreamlike artworks. They a created their own inspired pieces by moving their black marker around their paper without putting thought into it,

just letting their marker take control. They then added their own little Joan Miro touches (like eyes, stars, lines with circles on the end) and coloured parts in colours that Miro predominately uses - red, yellow, green and blue. Middle students finished their Grotti Lotti birds. The process included drawing a sketch of their bird, painting in watered down acrylic paint and creating drips, then adding details/ mark making to their birds

















# DIGITAL TECHNOLOGY DAVE HALL

Term 2 has seen the year 5-6 students really busy learning how to 3D print. They have been using technology to solve real world problems. This has been done through a series of tasks that get assigned to them using Google Classroom. All lessons and materials

are set in the classroom so students can access them at any time – even if I am away from school. There is a lesson overview for each task and a tutorial video I have

created that goes with each lesson. This allows students to

work at their own pace and caters for our 3 success criteria. Each student gets the lesson delivered to them individually at pace they can cope with, re-watch if need be and then ask questions if they have any. Students have created a name tag for bags or keys, a trolley token to release trolleys that require a \$1 or \$2 coin, a functioning dice and most recently had a toy brick introduced.

The 3D Print-A-Car students have been working diligently each Tuesday lunch time as the deadline to have their cars ready for testing closes in. The work they have been doing is amazing and it is great to see their creations come to life, get printed, inspected and then modified with changes they make.

Students were excited this week to see new print filaments arrive with a marble, glow in the dark and some glass colours added. Check their work out! It's pretty cool.


























## **SCHOOL BUILDING FUND**

### School Building Fund

The Sale Primary School Council have recently endorsed establishing a "School Building Fund".

The purpose of establishing this fund is to allow people and businesses to make a Tax Deductible Donation to the Building Fund. The proposed building will be covering the existing basketball court with a sample included below. Whilst the school has most of the funds, the remainder will need to be donated to ensure this project can be completed. Soon we will be seeking Tax Deductible Donations to hopefully raise the additional \$100,000.

The Rules require the school council to nominate persons to form a committee to manage and control the Fund. Members of the school council may also be members of this management committee. It is a requirement that a majority of the members of the management committee must be 'Responsible Persons'. It is recommended that a minimum of 3 people should form the management committee, all of whom are Responsible Persons.


A Responsible Person is an individual who:

- (a) performs a significant public function;
- (b) is a member of a professional body having a code of ethics or rules of conduct;
- (c) is officially charged with spiritual functions by a religious institution;
- (d) is a director of a company whose shares are listed on the Australian Stock Exchange;
- (e) has received formal recognition from government for services to the community; or
- (f) is approved as a Responsible Person by the Commonwealth Commissioner of Taxation.

Examples of persons who qualify as Responsible Persons include the school principal, a certified practising accountant (CPA), or a lawyer who has been admitted to legal practice. A parent of a student attending the school is not, simply by virtue of that status, a Responsible Person but can be if they meet one of the criteria stated above.

The Victorian Premiers' Reading Challenge is now open, and Sale Primary School is excited to be taking part!

The Challenge is open to all Victorian children from birth to Year 10 and aims to help young readers develop a lifelong love of reading.

It is not a competition; it is a personal challenge for children to read a set number of books by 5 September 2025.

Children from Prep to Year 2 are encouraged to read or 'experience' 30 books with their parents and teachers. Children from Year 3 to Year 10 are challenged to read 15 books.

All children who meet the Challenge will receive a certificate of achievement signed by the Victorian Premier and former Premiers.

# **Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund Reminder**

The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF) helps eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities.

If you have a valid means-tested concession card, or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. Means-tested concession cards must be valid on the first day of Term 1, 2025 (Tuesday 28 January 2025) or Term 2, 2025 (Tuesday 22 April 2025).

A student aged 16 years and over who is considered a mature minor and holds a valid concession card is also eligible to apply.

Eligible families will receive a payment of \$154 per year for primary school students and \$256 per year for secondary school students [remove primary/ secondary as necessary]. The funds will be paid directly to the school to be used towards camps, sports and excursion costs for the benefit of your child.

If you applied for CSEF through our school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

If you would like to apply for the first time, please contact the school office on 51445545 and ask for an application form. Please return completed application forms to the school office as soon as possible.

#### CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families o cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideratio category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your chi

The annual CSEF amount per student is:

- \$250 for secondary school students

- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.
