#### NAPLAN 2025


The years 3 and 5 student individual NAPLAN and whole school results have arrived.

Our Annual Implementation Plan targets were for the percentage of years 3 and 5 students to make the following progress:

#### NAPLAN

Percentage of students achieving "Exceeding or Strong" 2024 Year 3 students in writing from 73% to 75% Year 5 students in writing from 63% to 70%

Year 3 students in numeracy - maintain above 70% <u>(73% in 23)</u>739





The students achieved the target in all areas except the year 5 numeracy and year 5 reading. We are on track to meet most of the targets in 2026.


## ART ROOM NEWS LOU COOPER




