This **Friday November 7**, we will be holding our annual Foundation-Grade 2 Junior House Athletics Carnival. This event will be held **at school**, starting at **9:20am**, and **concluding** at **12:30pm**.

Track and Field Events

Students will participate in the following track and field events:

Foundation- 60m Sprint, 50m Hurdles, long run, long jump, sack race and throw for points challenge.

Grade 2-60m Sprint, 50m Hurdles, long run, long jump, shot put and high jump

Art Room News – Lou Cooper



Grade 5 and 6 students have learned about pseudonymous French street artist "Invader". To guard his anonymity he pixelates his own image or wears a mask during interviews. He is known for his ceramic tile mosaics modelled on the pixelated art of the 70's and 80's video games such as Space Invaders and Pac Man. Invader displays his work in multiple cities around the world in public spaces.

Students thought about what design they wanted to mosaic. The first step was drawing it out, pixelated style, on a small piece of grid paper. Using a small acetate sheet, students then placed the acetate over their drawing and glued each mosaic tile piece. Students then hid their mosaic

pieces around the school, just like Invader.




