Dear Parent/Guardians,

The first transition day at Sale College for Grade 6 students (Year 7, 2027) will be conducted on **Thursday 21<sup>st</sup> of May 2026**.

On this day, students will spend a full day at Sale College, experiencing classes in a variety of subjects, including English, Humanities, Maths, Science, Health and PE, Cultural Studies, and Technology. They will also receive general information about the programs and opportunities available to students at Sale College.

Students need to arrange their own transport to and from school. If they will be travelling by bus in 2027, they are able to catch these buses on the transition days too.

For this transition day all grade 6 students are encouraged to attend, even if you currently do not intend for your child to attend Sale College in 2027. This is a valuable experience for all students to experience a day at secondary school and to meet new people.

Students need to bring their **lunch, drink bottle and a pencil case**, and they need to wear their primary school uniform. The canteen will be open for the students. The students are able to pay by card or cash.

We will all meet on the basketball courts at 9am to welcome students and divide into groups before students begin their activity rotations for the day.

# Financial Assistance for Families



## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

### INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

Every Victorian child should have access to the world of learning opportunities that exist beyond the classroom. The Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund [helps](#) ensure that no student will miss out on the opportunity to join their classmates for important, educational and fun activities. It is part of making Victoria the Education State and the Government's commitment to breaking the link between a student's financial circumstances and their outcomes.

### CAMPS, SPORTS and EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

School camps provide children with inspiring experiences in the great outdoors. Excursions encourage a deeper understanding of how the world works while sports teach teamwork, discipline and leadership. All are a part of a healthy curriculum.

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and sporting activities.

If you hold a valid means-tested concession card [or](#) [support](#) an out of home care [student](#) you may be eligible for CSEF. A special consideration category also exists for asylum seeker and refugee families. The allowance is paid directly to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child.

The annual CSEF amount per student is \$400 for all school students.

### HOW TO APPLY

New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from the [website](#) below.

If you applied for CSEF at your child's school last year, you do not need to complete an application form this year unless there has been a change in your family circumstances.

You only need to complete an application form if any of the following changes have occurred:

- **new student enrolments:** your child has started or changed schools this year.
- **changed family circumstances:** such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number, or new siblings commencing this year.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.
